Rose Tips for June by Noah Wilson, Master Rosarian, Holston Rose Society

Things I will be doing to my roses in June:

- 1. Spray with a good fungicide on a regular basis, every week or two weeks as needed.
- 2. Spray for spider mite control every other week or wash under the leaves with a water wand. You only need to spray the bottom 12 to 16 inches of the plant.
- 3. Water well. Roses need an inch of water per week when well mulched.
- 4. Spray light colored blooms with Orthene for control of thrips when thrips are seen in blooms. The Orthene ratio is 1 teaspoon per gallon of water.
- 5. Continue deadheading by removing old blooms and sealing cut ends with exterior carpenter's glue.
- 6. Remove any cane die back from spring pruning.
- 7. Give roses a supplemental feeding of Easy Feed.
- 8. Check bushes regularly for signs of trouble.
- 9. Open my garden to friends and prospective new rose growing enthusiasts.
