Rose Tips by Noah Wilson, MR, Holston Rose Society

Now that all the canes have been cut back to 4 or 5 feet tall and bushes are mulched for any severe winter, I will prep my roses for ease of spring pruning. Things I am doing to my roses in February and the upcoming days:

- 1. I will in my free time pull all remaining leaves off the bushes leaving a neat clean looking bed.
- 2. I will check my mulch from time to time to be sure it has not gone down in depth and no critters have pulled it back away from the bush, leaving no winter protection.
- 3. I will spray with lime sulfur spray to help kill off any blackspot that may have been present last season.
- 4. I will prepare a new rose bed and place my order for new roses I may want for my garden.
- 5. I will remove any bushes I no longer feel I need or want in my garden, and see that they have a new home in someone else's garden. Even when I don't want a particular bush in my garden there is someone who does and I will make that gift.
- 6. I will clean and sharpen my pruning shears and have them ready for next spring.
- 7. I will continue to check the rose catalogues for roses and if I see some I feel I can't do without I will get them on order, and prepare my rose bed for their arrival.
- 8. As always I will encourage others to take up this hobby I love and have enjoyed for many years.
