REMINDER OUR IN-CLUB COMPETITION BEGINS THIS MONTH

MONTHLY IN-CLUB COMPETITION—JUNE - NOVEMBER

The competition shall consist of **ONE entry in each** of the following classes: One bloom per stem, except for sprays. Groom and fill in tags as if entering a regular rose show. Judges will comment on 1st, 2nd, and 3rd choice. The top scorer in horticulture and arrangements will be recognized at the December meeting.

Class 1—1 Single Bloom Hybrid Tea/Grandiflora

Class 2—Single Bloom Miniature

Class 3—1 Single Bloom Floribunda

Class 4—1 Floribunda or Miniature Spray

Class 5—Specimen, Any Other Type

Class 6—Rose in a Bowl—exhibition or open—large or small roses—NEW CLASS!!

Class 7—Arrangements—Any modern design using roses and only natural materials—large

Crown Gall by Sallie Blazer, Holston Rose Society, Newsletter Editor

While I was doing part of my spring fertilization on April 26, I found a mass at the base of one of the canes on my 'Hot Cocoa' rose bush. I immediately got my rose care book since I had never had a growth like this on any rose bush. I flipped to my diseases and pests section and learned that it was Crown Gall.

Crown Gall is a disease of the roots and crown caused by the bacterium *Agrobacterium tumefaciens*. Bacteria lives in the soil and enters plants through wounds, including the grafting/budding process. There is no therapy for infected plants. In order to control the disease, remove stems containing tumor formation and avoid wounding of the plant.

My 'Hot Cocoa' is healthy and showing no signs of a disease since I removed the one cane. I have already cut 19 blooms and there are at least 37 blooms/buds on the bush right now. (From the "Holston Rose" newsletter.)



June Rose Care by Noah Wilson, Master Rosarian, Holston Rose Society

Things I am doing to my roses in June:

1. Spray regularly with my favorite fungicide, per directions on the container, to prevent Black Spot.
2. Check for aphids and thrips and spray with an insecticide if any evidence is present.
3. Deadhead as blooms open and get past garden beauty. Seal end cuts with a water proof seal of carpenter's exterior glue.
4. Water regularly weekly an inch of water, if God does not send rain.
5. Feed roses with Mills Easy Feed as I water to supplement feeding of healthy, fast growing bushes.
6. Cut bouquets to share with shut-ins or prospective new rose growers.
7. Open my garden to others and share my knowledge to assist younger rose growers in improving their skills.

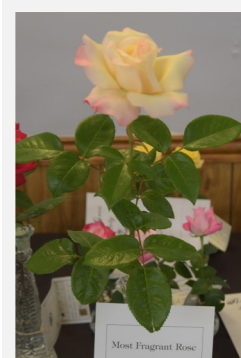
JACOBS OPEN GARDEN

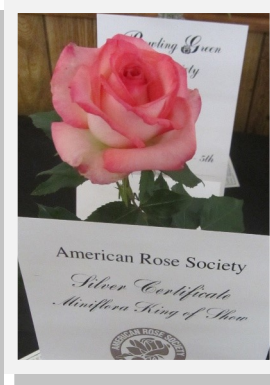
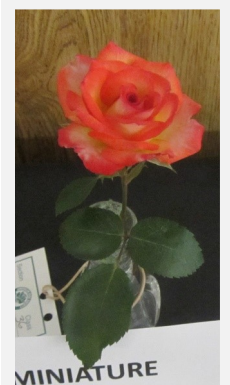
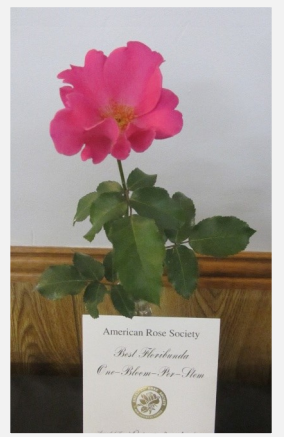
