November/December Rose Tips from Noah Wilson, MR, Holston Rose Society

Things I will do to my roses in November and December:

- 1. Until killing freezes begin to make my roses go dormant I will continue to spray, as long as growth is evident.
- 2. This time of year can produce some of the year's prettiest blooms with deep color and large blooms. I will back off of deadheading and let the bushes go dormant as Mother Nature will have them do. I will continue to cut blooms to bring in and share with friends.
- 3. After temperatures have gotten down to the mid 20's a couple of times I will begin to cut my bush tops back to about 4 or 5 feet. This is so the winter winds don't rock them back and forth creating a void space around the bush. A void allows rain water to fill in and possibly freeze, thus killing the bush.
- 4. I will, at this time, begin to mulch for winter protection pulling mulch up around the bush some 6 to 8 inches high to protect the bud union.
- 5. After this I will remove any unwanted bushes that I either don't want to keep or that did not perform to my expectation. These I may give to someone in hopes they too will get hooked on growing roses. I will prepare my holes with fresh compost or cow manure using ½ top soil, ½ humus and ½ sand or perlite, if needed. I will also add 2 cups Mills Magic Rose Mix in the bottom of the hole.
- 6. I will get my roses ordered for replacing the ones I removed and possibly add several new ones, too.

Watch out for POWDERY MILDEW ... in the fall conditions are IDEAL for powdery mildew, cool dry nights and warm days. The white or gray looking mildew grows on dry foliage and makes the leaves curl up.

Spray before any evidence of infection shows up: Use can use Immunox, Eagle or Daconil. Going Organic? Try Green Cure (potassium bicarbonate, www.GreenCure.net), Serenade (Bacillus subtilis – now the active ingredient in Bayer's Natria – RTU fungicide product) Jojo-ba Oil, or Southern Agriculture's Garden Friendly Fungicide.
