### **CR** Tip

It is a good idea to deadhead the day before spraying so that you are allowing the spray to get to parts of the bush that otherwise might be blocked. Also remove any blind shoots before spraying. "A reason for roses: Would you rather have 'Tropicana' or tranquilizers?"

### June in My Rose Garden by Mary Ann Hext, MR

Our rose show was just about two days too early for my blooms, but that is typical for rose shows—either too early or too late!.

Potluck

Some of the things I will be doing in June are::

- 1. Continuing my spray program with fungicides . I had not sprayed insecticides in over two years; but had to do it the day after our show as those little green worms had eaten every single leaf off of three knockout bushes and started on the Oso Easy bushes at the barn while I was in Frankfort.
- 2. I fertilized today with Mills Easy Feed; and mid-June, I will make alfalfa tea and apply that. I plan to do that until the end of August and then use Easy Feed for the last time the first week of September to prepare for our Tenarky District Show. I will use Bloomkote as a booster two weeks prior to the show so hopefully I will have blooms for it and for the Louisville Rose Show, the following Saturday. I will also be entering roses at the Cardinal Council Flower Show on June 15.
- 3. Studying the Kentucky State Fair Rose Show schedule to see if I might want to enter there in August.
- 4. Taking lots of photos to enter at the Tenarky District photo show.
- 5. Hopefully, not be picking off too many Japanese beetles later this month. Last year, I had very few, and they confined themselves to 'Strike it Rich' grandiflora and my 'Harry Lauder' bush and didn't bother the rest of the roses.



# BGRS Monthly In-Club Competition June - November

The competition shall consist of **ONE ENTRY PER MEMBER** in each of the following classes: One bloom per stem, except for sprays. Groom and fill in tags as if entering a regular rose show. Judges will award and comment on 1st-3rd places. Winners will be recognized at the December meeting. One point is given for each class entered. Three points will be given for 1st place, two for 2nd place, and one for 3rd place.

- Class 1 Single Bloom Hybrid Tea/Grandiflora exhibition form
- Class 2 Single Bloom Miniature/Miniflora exhibition form
- Class 3 Floribunda Single bloom or spray
- Class 4 Shrub Single bloom or spray (includes DA shrubs)
- Class 5 1 Specimen, Any Other Type
- Class 6 Rose in a Bowl any type of rose at any stage
  - 6a Exhibition Bloom
  - 6b Open Bloom
- **Class 7** Arrangement miniature traditional design (mass, line, or line mass)
