2023 TENARKY DISTRICT ROSES IN REVIEW REPORT

November and December in My Rose Garden by Mary Ann Hext, MR

Now that the weather is getting cooler and there are no more rose shows, I will start preparing my roses for the cold weather ahead. The October roses have bee beautiful with vibrant colors and larger blooms than in the hot summer months! However, cold weather is coming sooner than expected!

- 1. I will continue watering as needed—Fall months are sometimes as dry as the summer months.
- 2. I will continue my spray program with fungicides until Thanksgiving to be sure plants are healthy going into the winter months.
- 3. I fertilized for the last time Labor Day weekend so will not do that again until next spring.
- 4. I will continue keeping an eye out for rose rosette. After three years with only one or two bushes getting RRV, this year, I have had it on five bushes. I have removed three bushes after cutting the infected canes to the ground three times and it came back on new growth for the fourth time. I am waiting to see what happens on the other two bushes as they got it late in the summer and have only been cut back twice.
- 5. I will check the pH in all beds and made adjustments so beds will be correct in the spring. I actually checked it on October 28 and have several bushes that are below 6 and three that are below 5, so I plan to add lime next week.
- 6. I will transplant a few roses in pots into the ground and relocate two others. Fall is a good time to do this.
- 7. I will prepare my 35 pots of m/mf roses for moving to their winter home in the garage.
- 8. Since freezing temps are predicted next week (I am writing this October 28), I cut final bouquets this afternoon and took to the nursing home. Now I will just pull of the dead petals to signal the bushes it is time to prepare for winter.
- 9. As I did not add any additional mulch last winter and had severe damage to some of the bushes that have still not recovered from the flash freeze, I will be adding pine needles on some beds and hardwood mulch on others. When I was working, I mulched Thanksgiving weekend, but now I usually do it the first of December. With the exception of the extreme temperatures last December, I normally have more damage from the late spring freezes after the bushes have new leaves on them than any other time. We will discuss applying Vapor Gard at a spring meeting as our new members might want to try it.
- 10. I will take a very close look at roses that have not done well this year and make a plan to reduce the number of roses I will grow in 2024 most likely removing the ones damaged December that did not recover well this season unless they surprise me next spring.

2023 Award of Excellence Winners by Dr. Jim Herring

In 1973 the American Rose Society Board of Directors established the Award of Excellence to recognize new miniature and miniflora rose varieties of superior quality and marked distinction. Since the inception of the Award, there have been 141 AOE winners.

Miniature and miniflora roses which have been in commerce for less than one year, as well as unnamed seedlings or sports, are eligible for evaluation for two to three years in seven AOE public test gardens and two private gardens, spaced geographically across the United States. Since 2013 roses may be entered in a "no spray" division, a "preventive spray" division or both. Each public garden has an AOE supervisor and five evaluators who score the entries on 11 criteria four times during each growing season.

At the end of the trial period, Awards of Excellence are given to deserving entries, with a maximum of five per year. The public test gardens are: American Rose Center, Shreveport, Louisiana; Edisto Memorial Gardens, Orangeburg, South Carolina; Farmers Branch Public Rose Garden, Farmers Branch, Texas; International Rose Test Garden, Portland, Oregon; Mesa Community College Garden, Mesa, Arizona; Toledo Botanical Gardens, Toledo, Ohio; and Virginia Clemens Rose Garden, St. Cloud, Minnesota.






The official public announcement of the Award of

Excellence winner(s) is made each year in American Rose and at the awards banquet of the ARS National Rose Show and Conference. After two years of evaluation (three for climbers) four Award of Excellence winners have

been selected. The 2023 AOE winners are 'Midnight Fire™', an orange blend miniature, and 'Life's Little Pleasures™', a mauve miniflora, both hybridized by Christian Bedard, 'Baby Dainty Bess', a miniature medium pink single, hybridized by Jim Sproul and 'Ringo™', a vellow miniflora with a red center, hybridized by Chris Warner.


